SYNOPSIS

When 22 year-old Rae, a descendant of Holocaust survivors, is targeted by Neo-Nazis in Billings, Montana, her ancestors' trauma becomes real. After hitting a low, Rae returns home to her mother and uncovers the truth about a childhood accident. As antisemitism continues to rise in the community, we follow Rae on her journey to forgive herself, her mother, and the broken world.

Inspired by true events, this coming-of-age story shows the inherited effects of historical trauma and the strength of survival and healing.

Shot on location on the traditional lands of the Cheyenne, Crow, Blackfeet, Sioux, Salish, and Kalispel people, also known as Billings, Butte, and Missoula, Montana.



DIRECTOR STATEMENT

I made this film in order to sort through my feelings about my Jewish identity, the inherited effects of historical trauma, and what self-acceptance and self-love looks like. WE BURN LIKE THIS is my debut feature, which I have been developing for the last six years. It is my contribution to the greater healing of Jewish bigotry, which continues to be even more important, timely, and urgent.

I never met my grandparents. They were taken from their homes near Radomsko, Poland in 1942 and survived forced labor camps as young teenagers in Russia. I have been told that my grandfather survived a period of time by eating grass.

After the war, my grandparents found themselves at a displaced persons camp in Germany. This is where my dad was born, and two years later they were able to immigrate to Brooklyn, New York. My grandparents were proud to be Americans, but my father grew up ashamed of his immigrant and Jewish identities as it was often the reason he was singled out, threatened, and bullied.

The day after the 2016 election, Neo-Nazi pamphlets showed up on the doorsteps of Har Shalom Synagogue in Missoula, Montana where I was living at the time. For the first time in my life, my family's history was suddenly very real.

The storming of the capitol on January 6th was a continued reminder after an exhausting and frightening four years that we are living beside much hatred and rage, and our new administration does not erase the true colors and feelings of our fellow Americans. I believe that it matters to share this story and inspire discussion about Jewish identity and historical trauma in present day America.

May we find a way to forgive, accept, and love ourselves and others. May we find the perfection even in the darkest times and in the darkest memories. May this film be a part of that process, and may we all radically heal.

Her recent work includes playing Sam Duchene in season 3 of CTV's CARDINAL, Lilith in the Netflix Original THE ORDER, and Sam Black Crow in season 2 and 3 of Neil Gaiman's AMERICAN GODS on Starz.

Jacobs has explored the other side of the camera, and her recent short film as a writer/director, RAE, was an official selection of the 2018 Palm Springs Shortfest and won Best Youth Work at 2017 ImagineNATIVE Film Fest. The feature film THIS PLACE, co-written by Jacobs, was recently named a recipient of the Talent to Watch fund from Telefilm Canada, and Jacobs is currently producing the film adaptation of the award winning play, WHAT I CALL HER.

She stars in the 2022 Indie Spirit Award and 2021 Gotham Award winning FX series RESERVATION DOGS, and can be seen in the new Peacock show RUTHERFORD FALLS.

KENDRA MYLNECHUK Layne

Kendra is a Lummi Montana based actor featured in CHRISTMAS UNDER WRAPS (Hallmark), 2 DAYS IN NEW YORK, NATIVES, THE BLACKLIST (NBC), WINTER IN THE BLOOD, THE TRIANGLE and COPPER CITY. She won best actor in the NBC/Universal Short Cuts film festival for her role in OK BREATHE AURALEE. Her work has been screened at Sundance, SXSW, TriBeCa, and other festivals around the world. In addition to her work on film, Kendra is co-founder of theatre company MT+NYC Collaborative, and works as a producer, writer, director, and performer with them and other companies. She is currently co-producer and subject of DAUGHTER OF A LOST BIRD (Maoriland Film Festival, HotDocs, Human Rights Watch Film Festival, National broadcast on America ReFramed May 2022) a documentary about her adoption, finding her birth mother and a way back to the Lummi Nation.

Casidee Riley was born and raised in Montana. She has worked extensively in the theatrical community, appearing in such shows as Venture Theatre's 'Tape' and 'Picasso at the Lapin Agile;' Billings Studio Theatre's 'Proof' and 'Boeing, Boeing;' NOVA's 'Sweet Charity;' and in Grandstreet Theatre's 'Once Upon a Mattress' and '42nd Street.' A graduate of Montana State University-Billings, Casidee has taught acting workshops for both youths and adults in Montana and Los Angeles. She was also a member of the Venture Theatre Improv Troupe, per forming game-based improv weekly for 7 1/2 years.

Casidee lived and worked in Los Angeles for six years with film credits including 'The New Republic,' 'Sell Hope,' and the principle role of Miranda in the comedy-horror feature 'So You've Downloaded a Demon.' Back now in Montana, Casidee is an ensemble member of Yellowstone Repertory Theatre, most recently appearing as Meg in 'Crimes of the Heart' and Gwendolen Fairfax in 'The Importance of Being Earnest,' and Becca in 'Rabbit Hole.

ANGELO RIZZO Wolf

Angelo Rizzo hails from Queens, New York and made his exodus from the big apple to the big sky in 2000. He is a father, husband, friend, actor, writer, director, and dramaturg. He graduated with a degree in acting from the University of Montana School of Drama and received his MFA in Media Arts. Alana Waksman is an Ashkenazi writer, director, producer, and first generation descendant of Holocaust survivors from Poland. She is an alum of the USC School of Cinematic Arts MFA in Film & Television Production, and Connecticut College BA in Theater and English. As an actor, she trained at Shakespeare & Company, Berkshire Theater Festival, St. Petersburg Dramatic Arts Academy in Russia, and The O'Neill National Theater Institute where she studied under Colman Domingo.

While at USC, Alana was chosen as one of ten top directors to co-direct USC's first feature film, DON QUIXOTE: THE INGENIOUS GENTLEMAN OF LA MANCHA (Palm Springs International Film Festival). Her short film BLACKOUT, written by David Haskell, received the Audience Award at the LA Shorts Fest, and Best Actor and Best Cinematography at the Women's Independent Film Festival.

WE BURN LIKE THIS, Alana's award-winning debut feature, premiered at Santa Barbara International Film Festival in April 2021, internationally at Deauville American Film Festival in competition in September, and is currently in the festival circuit.

Alana is in development for her second narrative feature, and a personal documentary about her father's relationship to Jewish identity, also executive produced by Neda Armian.
